HIGHLIGHTS

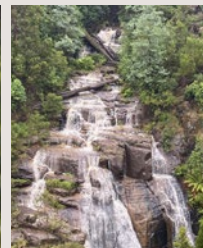

HISTORY & HERITAGE

DID YOU KNOW?

There is no lake at Kinglake! The Kinglake township was named after British historian Alexander William Kinglake. The Kinglake Ranges ridgeline also marks the boundary of two indigenous territories of the Kulin Nation - the Wurundjeri to the south and the Taungurung to the north.

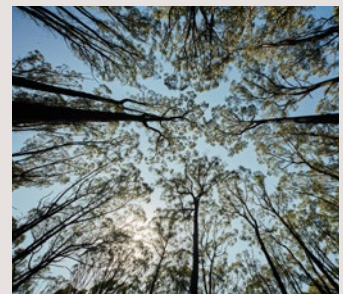

WALKS

Kinglake National Park and Toolangi State Forest both feature a multitude of walks for all ages and abilities. The Lyrebird Circuit Walk at Masons Falls is 500m long and specifically designed for people with limited mobility.



Wombelano Falls – K14 Located in the Kinglake National Park is a winding 1.5 km circuit walk leading to a viewing platform.

Wirra Willa Rainforest Walk – UU21 Located in the Toolangi State Forest is home to ancient Gondwana rainforest species.

Kinglake Heritage Trail – M10 Discover the history of the Kinglake Ranges via a series of interpretive boards between Kinglake and Kinglake West.

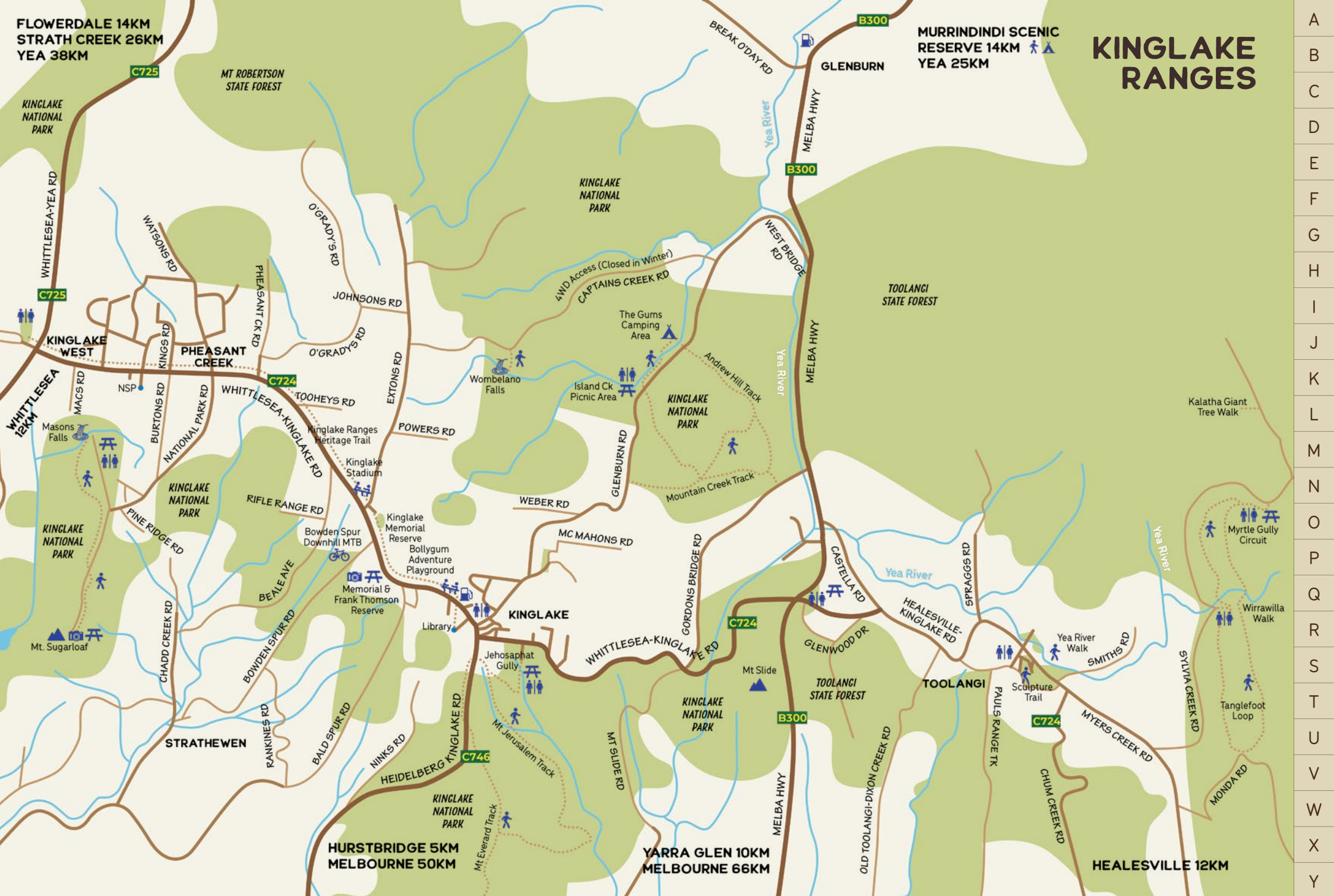

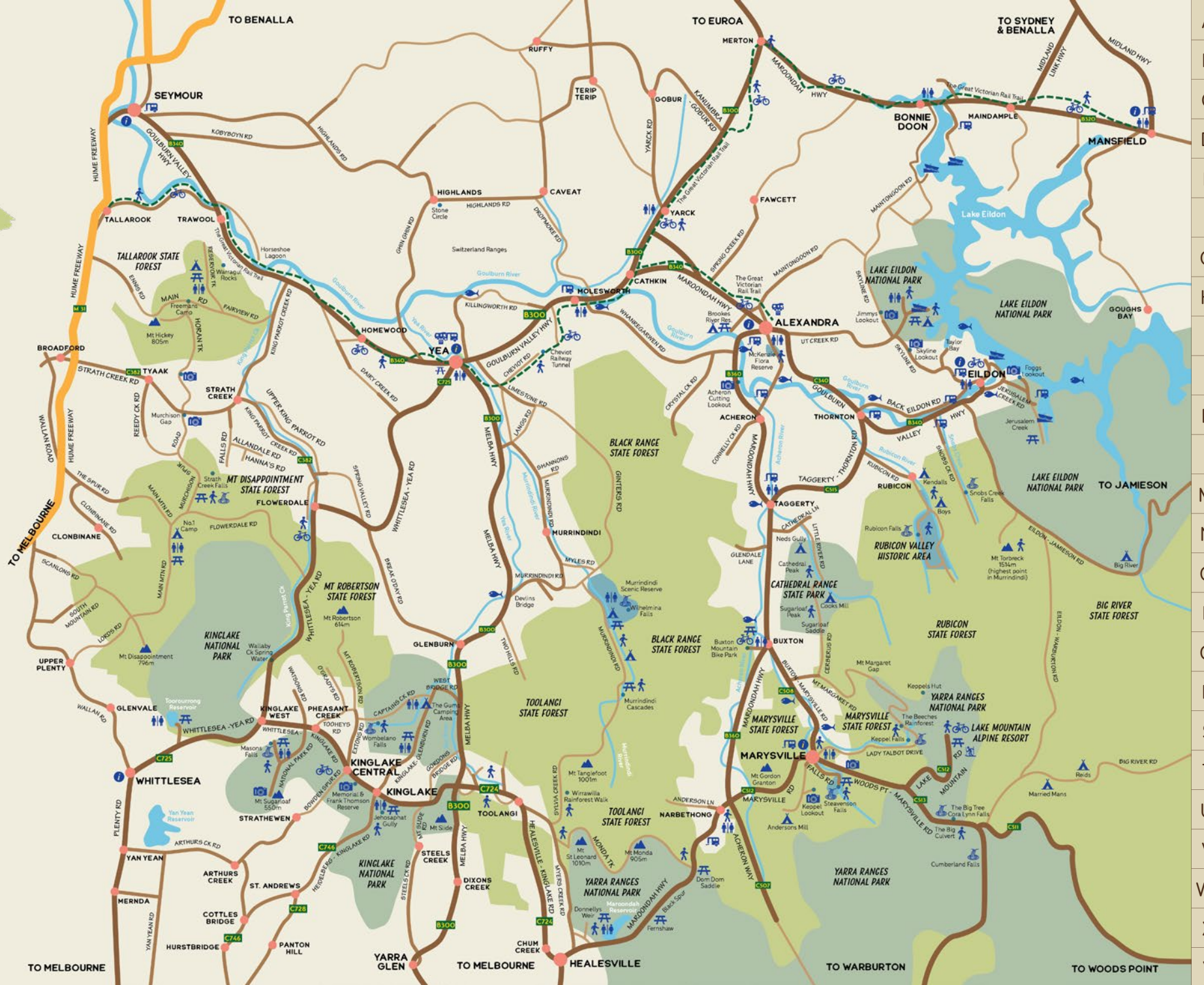
